

Shred For Good and PRI Productions Join Forces To Offer “Free Shred Day”

--June 4th Event is Open to Individuals & Businesses--

Jacksonville, FL (April 28, 2008)— Shred for Good, a secure document destruction nonprofit that employs individuals with disabilities, will partner with San Marco-based PRI Productions to offer area businesses and individuals the opportunity to shred their sensitive business and personal documents free of charge. X-Rays, CD's, DVD's and computer hard drives may also be turned in for secure destruction. Shred for Good is a division of Clay County-based Challenge Enterprises.

The event will take place on June 4th, 2008 between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM in the parking lot of PRI Production's headquarters at 1819 Kings Avenue in San Marco. Shred for Good will provide locked bins into which the documents can be placed. The bins will then be transported to Shred for Good's secure facility in Green Cove Springs for shredding.

“We are delighted to be working with PRI Production and look forward to providing this valuable service to businesses and people in Jacksonville,” said Nancy Keating, Executive Director of Challenge Enterprises, Shred for Good's parent organization. “Shred for Good typically works with large businesses and government offices, institutions such as hospitals, medical offices, law firms and schools that need regular on-going pick-ups or seasonal purges of documents that require shredding. This type of service can be cost-prohibitive for smaller businesses and individuals that have personal documents they want safely destroyed—they don't have the volume to justify a regular service. So, by offering a Free Shred Day, we can give back to the community that supports us, maintain employment for individuals with disabilities and collect paper for shredding which we then bale and sell to recyclers. It's not only a win-win for everyone who participates, but a win-win for the environment too.”

“Shred for Good's services and focus on serving people really resonate with me,” said Randy Goodwin, President and CEO of PRI Productions. “Our company has a strong history of supporting the community and helping out when there's a need. Working with Shred for Good to offer a Free Shred Day helps small businesses like ours safely dispose of sensitive records and it supports this terrific nonprofit that's helping people often marginalized in the mainstream to stay productive and independent. Shred for Good is an active member of the National Association of Information Destruction (NAID) and the Secure Document Alliance (SDA). Shred for Good is currently providing secure document destruction services statewide and is part of a national contract with the federal government.
